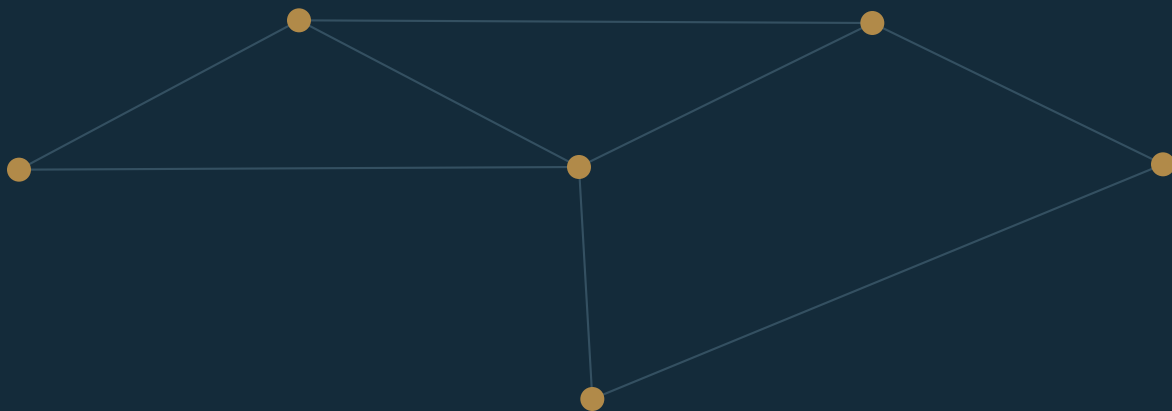

READER'S GUIDE

One record. Six people.

This R2 edition brings Bedard, Lucy, Moskowitz, Sutton, Seasonwein and McArdle into one source-linked PDF. The new maps show shared institutions and reported professional connections; the detailed research, all fifteen pairings and four archival-request drafts follow in the same file.

The map pages are an added synthesis, not a finding that anyone coordinated a decision. The prior dossier's substantive pages and source IDs S01–S34 are retained. X01–X02 identify the additional records used for the committee and same-document paths.

Degree endpoints are separated from verified attendance periods. A directory report is not a registrar certification.

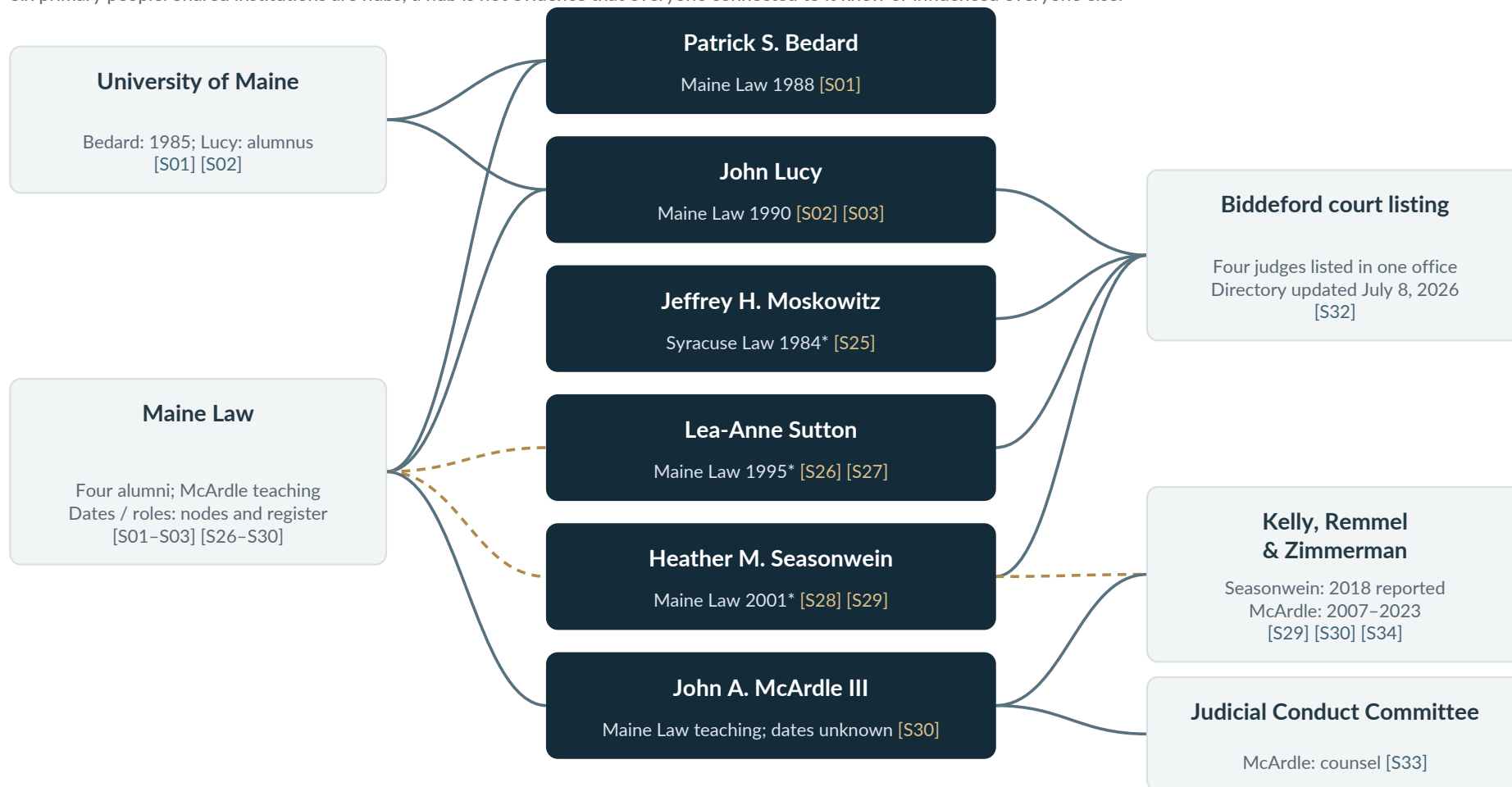

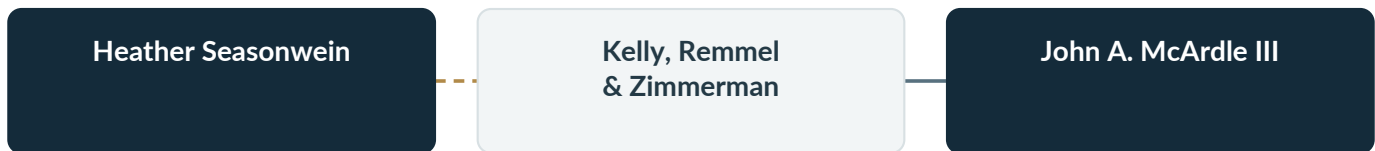

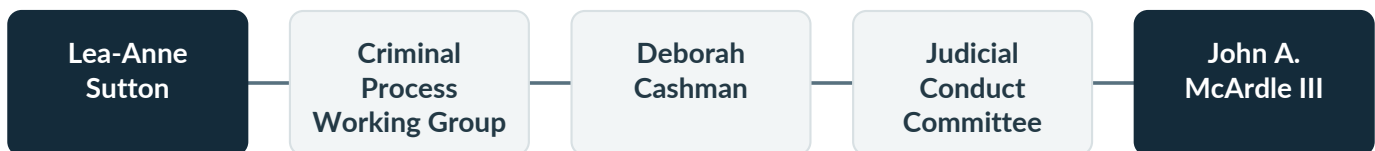
These are separate source trails. No route is labeled as an influence channel or as evidence of joint decision-making.

01 / REPORTED SAME-FIRM OVERLAP



Seasonwein's profile lists KRZ in 2018; KRZ places McArdle there during 2007–2023. Her dates still require a contemporaneous firm record. [S29] [S30] [S34]

02 / TWO PUBLIC ROSTERS, ONE INTERMEDIATE OFFICIAL



Sutton is chair; Cashman is a judicial liaison. Cashman is also listed as a CJC member and McArdle as counsel. This documents an indirect institutional path, not participation in a particular complaint. [X01] [S33]

03 / SAME PUBLISHED DOCUMENT



Both names appear in the signature list. The letter prints McArdle without a suffix; the source does not establish joint drafting, personal acquaintance or joint event attendance. [X02]

Additional association lead: McArdle's MTLA executive service is dated; Seasonwein's listed MTLA board service is not. Contemporaneous service has not been established. [S31] [S29]

MAP REGISTER

What each line means

An edge is a specific, source-supported assertion. It is never shorthand for friendship, bias or an undisclosed agreement.

Sutton — working group — Cashman	Public chair / judicial-liaison roles. Establishment date: August 25, 2025; membership reflected in the retrieved roster. [X01]
Cashman — CJC — McArdle	Public member / counsel roles in separate capacities. Not a finding about any complaint's participants. [S33]
Seasonwein — letter — McArdle	Names co-appear in the October 4, 2018 signature list; no personal relationship inferred. [X02]

All fifteen person-to-person combinations are retained on pages 17–18. The new Cashman and same-letter paths supplement the Sutton–McArdle and Seasonwein–McArdle entries, respectively.

VERIFICATION / SCOPE

What changed in the map edition

Added: an all-six-person front register, a full-page affiliation web, a second map tracing firm and committee connections, and a source-keyed edge register. The six subjects now appear together on the cover and in the visual overview.

Rechecked online: the official district-judge directory; the Judicial Branch's CJC roster; the Criminal Process Stakeholders Working Group roster; the KRZ retirement notice; Seasonwein's directory work history; and the 2018 published signature list. Sources X01–X02 add the paths not developed in the retained dossier. [S29] [S30] [S32] [S33] [X01] [X02]

The central limitation remains: no verified common fraternity, shared course, friendship or private arrangement has been established for the six-person group. No graph layout can supply an absent relationship record.

EARLIER CHAT CLAIMS KEPT AS SOURCE-RECOVERY LEADS

The earlier conversation reported Lucy's undergraduate year as 1986 and McArdle's undergraduate institution as UMass Boston, 1984. The underlying supporting records are not authenticated in the retained dossier. Those details are therefore not upgraded into verified school-map entries here. They remain named verification targets, not findings of non-attendance.

The earlier Bedard–Mark Lawrence–Moskowitz hypothesis likewise requires the underlying former-firm record and dated prosecutor-office employment history. It is not drawn as an established person-to-person connection. These are carry-forward notes from the conversation, not new independent research findings.

WHAT THE NEXT RECORD SHOULD ANSWER

Obtain exact attendance dates; named organization rosters; a dated 2018 KRZ roster; McArdle's Maine Law teaching assignments; MTLA annual rosters; and any available, complaint-specific participation or withdrawal records. The four draft institutional requests remain on pages 20–23 and have not been sent.

This edition does not purport to search all archives, determine a legal conflict, or establish how any particular judge or oversight participant reached a decision.

Executive findings

CENTRAL FINDING

The record supports shared educational institutions and probable periods of overlap between Bedard and Lucy. It does not presently establish friendship, a shared fraternity, a shared class or a common student organization. [S01] [S02] [S03] [U01]

Practical conclusion: the remaining task is to obtain dated, name-bearing records. Institutional proximity justifies focused research; it does not supply the missing personal connection.

02 / IDENTITIES

Names, degrees and chronology

Patrick S. Bedard

Bedard's own professional biography is the principal education source. It reports high-school graduation in 1981, UMaine Orono graduation in 1985, and Maine Law graduation in 1988. Its reference to political science and philosophy is retained as written, without converting it into an independently verified degree nomenclature. [S01]

John Lucy

The September 21, 2012 state swearing-in release confirms both universities and identifies his prior firm. The August 20, 2012 BDN profile supplies the 1990 law-school year and football background. His undergraduate graduation year remains unresolved. [S02] [S03]

Search variants—not additional identity findings

Bedard: Patrick S. Bedard; Patrick Bedard; Pat Bedard; P. S. Bedard; Patrick Scott Bedard. **Lucy:** John Lucy; John B. Lucy; John B Lucy; J. B. Lucy; J. Lucy. The expanded middle name and initial are retained from the supplied report as search variants, not authenticated university-record facts. [U01]

IDENTITY CONTROL

Require a matching school, profession, chronology or other public identifier before merging same-name results. Graduation years establish endpoints—not every intervening semester.

03 / UMAINE

The 1983 football lead

The most useful addition in the supplied research is a dated UMaine activity anchor for Lucy. The university catalog identifies the *2007 UMaine Black Bears Football Media Guide* as an Athletic Media Relations Office publication. The catalog establishes provenance for the guide; it is not itself a roster naming Lucy. [S04]

The searchable mirror places the name in the third-row caption. BDN's later profile independently identifies Judge Lucy as a former UMaine football player. Together they materially reduce the namesake concern and support the attribution, while the unrendered original page remains an important verification gap. [S03] [S04] [S05]

What the record establishes—and what it does not

This is evidence of a specific historical football affiliation. It is not evidence that Bedard played football, attended a team event, belonged to the same social circle or appears in the photograph. No joint Bedard–Lucy photograph was located in the supplied research. [U01]

The source report also flags other football references to **Bob Lucy**. Surname-only matches must not be merged with John Lucy. A caption, roster and independent biography are stronger than visual resemblance or a shared surname. [U01] [S05]

The next record to obtain

Request the original historical team-photo page and any 1983 roster containing class year or biographical information. Compare that record with Bedard's 1983 directory or registrar attendance entry. The first fixes Lucy's campus chronology; the second tests the inferred undergraduate overlap.

PUBLICATION CONTROL

No team photograph is reproduced here, and no person is identified from facial appearance. The football finding rests on the caption text and biographical corroboration. The original source page should be obtained before publishing the image itself.

Yearbooks: the precise retrieval targets

What would count as a fraternity record

A dated chapter roster, member or officer list, initiation record, house composite with a reliable caption, alumni directory or contemporary newspaper notice could establish an affiliation. Merely appearing at an event or in an unidentified photograph would not establish membership.

Beyond the yearbooks

Fogler's historical-resource guide identifies the *Maine Campus*, yearbooks, alumni publications and other university-history material. For Bedard, prioritize fall 1981 through spring 1985; for Lucy, begin with the 1983 football season. Combine names with fraternity, Greek Week, football, pre-law, student government, political science and philosophy. [\[S11\]](#) [\[S01\]](#) [\[S05\]](#)

ACCESS NOTE

Legacy yearbook links redirected to replacement discovery or displayed a sunset notice. Fogler confirms migration to its new institutional repository. An unavailable scan is not a negative membership finding. [\[S10\]](#)

04 / MAINE LAW

Overlap is not a shared activity

The 1987–88 hypothesis

If both men followed ordinary three-academic-year law-school sequences, the 1988 and 1990 graduation endpoints imply a shared campus year in 1987–88. That remains an inference until directories or dates-of-attendance records establish actual enrollment. It does not independently show a shared course or acquaintance. [S01] [S03]

Phi Alpha Delta

Maine Law’s current student-organizations page lists Phi Alpha Delta as a professional law fraternity. That is a present-day institutional affiliation, not retrospective proof. Historical membership requires three separate answers: whether the chapter was active in the relevant period, whether Bedard belonged, and whether Lucy belonged. None is established by the present page. [S12]

Maine Law Review

The supplied report searched exposed article/comment indexes for the following issues and reported no relevant Bedard or Lucy authorship. The full staff mastheads were not obtained, so the result does not exclude editorial or staff membership. This edition retains that limited search finding rather than presenting it as a complete roster audit. [U01] [S13]

Request Student Bar Association records; moot-court and trial-advocacy rosters; Barristers’ Ball and orientation programs; class photographs; commencement programs; alumni newsletters; and historical fraternity material. Maine Law’s institutional-history collection is a discovery route, not an independent joint-participation finding. [S20]

THE MISSING LINK

No retrieved class list, club roster, event program or photograph establishes that both men participated together. A named, dated activity record would add something graduation years cannot. [U01]

05 / PROVENANCE

Evidence trails, with the limits intact

Each trail separates the initial source from the underlying record and the proposition actually supported. A three-part source trail is not a claim that every linked archive was successfully retrieved.

Why the access distinction matters

The supplied report's precise yearbook page references survive as useful leads even when the former endpoint no longer serves the scan. Fogler now directs users to replacement discovery. This edition does not quietly convert an old index entry into a completed original-page inspection. [\[U01\]](#) [\[S10\]](#)

Likewise, failure to find a name in an article index cannot establish absence from the journal's staff. Searches can be incomplete because a record was never digitized, was poorly indexed, is access-restricted or has moved. Those are limitations, not evidence of concealment.

The limits on negative findings

The supplied research did not locate a fraternity roster naming either man, a shared chapter list, a joint event program, a joint photograph, a shared class list or a contemporary story naming them together. It also did not retrieve complete relevant Law Review mastheads. These are bounded search outcomes, not proofs of nonexistence. [\[U01\]](#)

RESEARCH CONCLUSION

The strongest conclusion remains shared institutions, probable temporal overlap and an unresolved question of personal or organizational connection. The next investigation should seek the missing record —not repeat the inference as an established relationship.

What changes in the educational picture

Sutton and Seasonwein join Bedard and Lucy in the documented/reported Maine Law alumni group, but with different graduation years. The located biographies place Moskowitz at Syracuse and McArdle at Suffolk for law school. It would be inaccurate to present all six as Maine Law classmates. [S01] [S02] [S03] [S25] [S26] [S27] [S28] [S30]

McArdle has a different Maine Law connection: his former firm reports that he taught Trial Practice there. The notice gives neither teaching dates nor the names of students. It therefore establishes an institutional teaching link, not that he taught Bedard, Lucy, Sutton or Seasonwein. [S30]

VERIFICATION NOTE

Trellis returned useful indexed biography text but direct-page access was blocked. The listed degree years for Moskowitz, Sutton and Seasonwein are therefore labeled as reported secondary information. The supplement does not treat search snippets as certified academic records. [S25] [S26] [S28]

Professional links beyond schooling

A confirmed shared court-office affiliation

The Maine Judicial Branch's District Court directory, marked updated July 8, 2026, lists Lucy, Moskowitz, Sutton and Seasonwein with the same Biddeford court office. This is a direct institutional connection among the four judges. It is not evidence of a shared social relationship, joint deliberation or coordination in any particular case. [S32]

Seasonwein and McArdle: a reported firm overlap

Seasonwein's Avvo work history lists an attorney position at **Kelly, Remmel & Zimmerman in 2018**. A second directory also links her to that firm. KRZ's own retirement notice places McArdle at the firm from 2007 through the end of 2023. Read together, these support a **reported same-firm overlap in 2018**. [S29] [S34] [S30]

The Seasonwein employment date remains secondary-source information. Her profile also contains a stale "Present" field for another firm despite showing judicial status, so it is not relied on for current employment. A contemporaneous KRZ roster or hiring/departure notice is the next verification target. The sources do not show shared files, supervision, partnership status together or a personal friendship. [S29] [S34]

Association and oversight links

KRZ reports McArdle's Maine Trial Lawyers Association presidency in 2011 and 2012. Seasonwein's directory lists MTLA board service without dates. This is an association-level lead; simultaneous board service has not been established. Dated annual rosters would test it. [S31] [S29]

The official Committee on Judicial Conduct roster identifies McArdle as Committee Counsel. That is a current institutional role, not proof that he handled a particular complaint or had a personal relationship with a particular judge. [S33]

DISTINCT TYPES OF CONNECTION

School affiliation, a shared court office, a reported employer overlap and an oversight role are different facts. None should be substituted for evidence of private acquaintance or influence.

07 / ALL-PAIRS INVENTORY

Connections involving Bedard and Lucy

The six-person scope produces fifteen unique pairs. The inventory records what the cited sources support. “No direct tie established” describes this report’s evidence, not a conclusion that people have never met.

The retained report and earlier chat are research navigation aids, not independent proof of their own underlying assertions. The new maps do not turn a secondary-source claim into a primary-source fact.

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Follow the source. Keep the limits visible.
